How?

We'd love to encourage all the families at The Lakes to be reading the bible together. There are a variety of resources to purchase, but if you'd like to try a simple method of reading the bible together, we'd love you to try the Swedish Method ([article](#) for more info). [Here](#) is a fun template for families to use, or simply discuss using these prompts.

Pray – asking God to help us understand his word and know and love him more.

Read the passage & then **discuss** using these symbols:



Anything that stands out to you from the passage. It could be important to the passage or something that strikes you.



What questions do you have about what you've read? Is there anything that's hard to understand?



How does this apply to me? Is there an example to follow? Or something about God to learn and remember?

Pray together about the things you've discovered in the passage, and how you can apply it.

Ideas for digging deeper

- You might like to watch the [Bible Project overview of Ephesians](#) – it may help you explore the book even if your children are not at an age to grasp the whole video
- Using paper (large or regular sized), **draw** the flow of the letter. Add to it each time you read a new part. Record any questions and application too. You could even write down any answers to questions that you may discover either from further reading in the letter, from other parts of the bible or other sources.
- Pictionary, Charades & Playdough Pictionary can be used to focus on ideas and things you have been reading about. Chat about it once the word/concept is guessed.

Bible Version
